Two events for all ages are the STEM Expo, which will feature hands-on learning opportunities for all ages, and the Studio Open House, which will demonstrate all that our Audiovisual Studio has to offer. A mining-themed activity for kids with interactive experiences such as extracting chocolate chips from cookies, is another highlight. Additional offerings include craft activities and music bingo.
