PWC2021-04 Delaware Drive Roadway Improvement Project

REQUEST

The City pursued additional state funds for street light improvements on Apache Trail between Palo Verde Drive to SR88 and on Superstition Boulevard between Meridian Drive and SR88 to cover the increased construction costs in the amount of \$96,000 since the design began in 2022. Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) attempts to utilize all the spending authority made available to the region. Unobligated funds are available through the end of the current state fiscal year (June 30th).
