501 c(3)

A valid, non-profit organization as qualified by the Internal Revenue Service and as registered with the Arizona Secretary of State, Arizona Corporation Commission or other appropriate state office.

Chris & I started “Bigger Than Us” as School Resource Officers after we learned the second way we are losing our youth is by suicide, second only to traffic collisions...And the number one way we are losing our First Responders is by suicide. Chris and I speak about First Responder Suicide, provide training for agencies and help bring professional youth speaker(s) to schools to combat this issue.

Our primary demographic population is: Youth & First Responders including but not limited to Military, Dispatchers, & Medical Professionals.

Chris and I started the City's (Second largest city in our county) first ever Youth Academy, First Anti-Bully & Anti Suicide Campaign that successfully brought in a Nationally known speaker (Marc Mero "Thinkpoz.org") to 7 schools in our district. This resulted in Chris & I being able to help approximately 100 or more students who had suicidal ideations that had not yet come forward for help.

We continue to speak, train, educate and sponsor First Responders & Military Personnel around the United States. We have helped approximately 140 members seek professional treatment.

Chris and I have sponsored the First Responder softball game between Apache Junction Police and Fire department.

We have also recently assisted with the Apache Junction Cadet program.

We are also in the process of providing Mental Wellness training for the First Responders in Apache Junction & surrounding agencies.

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Problem Statement

What is the nature and extent of the problem to which you are trying to address?

We are addressing suicide prevention and mental health awareness in our youth and First Responders.

To whom is this happening?

Teens/youth and to our First Responders.

Why is this happening? What are the reasons or causes for the problem?

Childhood and work related traumas that are going untreated. Often these traumas are being passed on or not addressed due to fear or not having the knowledge of proper resources/therapy.

Chris and I were both School Resource Officers and lost several students to suicide. According to the CDC (Center for Disease Control) Teen suicide is the second leading cause of death amongst teens, second only to traffic collisions.

First Responder Suicide is the Leading Cause of Death for our Police and Fire departments...Bluehelp.org

I (Jeremy) personally lost my mentor, friend and fellow co-worker to suicide. I had no clue he was even hurting at the time and needed help.

Both Chris and I have completed an In Patient PTSD treatment facility and have personally met hundreds of First Responders that are suffering from suicidal ideation all over the country.



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What will happen if the problem is not addressed?

Our youth and First Responders will continue to suffer and take their own lives. Not knowing there is help available.

What are the gaps between what exists and the solution?

The major gap we have discovered is that those suffering are afraid to reach out and ask for help due to the social stigma(s) associated with suicide and the feelings of having no hope to change.

Often those suffering, are not aware of how a professional skilled therapist can help.



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Is there local documentation which identifies this as a problem?

Yes, ...CDC has statistics on youth suicide.

Bluehelp.org tracks First Responder suicide and has current statistics on this issue.

Militaryveteranproject.org has updated information on Military Veteran suicide.

Has the city or the commission identified this as a problem?

Yes,Youth & First Responder Suicide is an issue that affects all States, Cities and Towns throughout the nation.



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Project Proposal

We plan to bring in a Nationally Known speaker to the schools to combat the issues of bullying & youth suicide.

Chris and I plan on providing training for First Responders and will continue educating First Responders.

We will also continue providing financial sponsorship for those wanting to seek Treatment for mental health.

Yes, the National Speaker we work with confidentially provides us with a list of youth struggling w/suicide. We then provide this to a trained counselor that can work with them.

This is an ongoing and continuing effort.

This is the Second leading way we are losing our youth, and the number One way We are losing our First Responders.

The Military/veterans, youth and First Responders of Apache Junction.

We will continue what we are doing...ie : Speaking, training and providing financial Assistance for mental wellness.
