HISTORY OF SENIOR SERVICES

- Formerly managed by non-profit, East Valley Adult Resources (EVAR)
- EVAR funded primarily by federal AAA funds through Pinal Gila Council for Senior Citizens (PGCSC)
- HHS funded a small portion of costs, and the City provided the facility operations, office space, and utilities via Parks & Recreation
- EVAR gave notice in 2017 no longer able to operate
- City Council voted in 2017 to continue the services via Parks & Recreation
- HHS funding was reduced by 28k and this money was returned to the general fund to offset operations now funded directly by the City
