

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Organization Information

- 1. Begin Again Homes (BA) will provide gap housing to parents with minor children, seniors, veterans and general population who are unsheltered due to economic distress. They need to be on the By Name List through Pinal County End The Homelessness Coalition and be approved for a housing voucher. Once permanent housing is located, we will provide stability and fill in the waiting time with free housing until final housing inspection and they receive the keys.
- 2. BAH provides short-term emergency shelter utilizing Motel 6 to families and individuals who have received housing vouchers and awaiting final inspections on permanent housing. We have established an MOU (Memorandum of Understanding) with discounted rates unavailable to the public.
- 3. Matching up short-term emergency housing solutions with clients who need assistance.

The targeted population is 100% Apache Junction. We have and will only serve the community of Apache Junction.

The demographics are parents of any age with minor children in their care, seniors, veterans and general population who lack stable housing and who obtain housing vouchers through an agency that serves Apache Junction.

There is no discrimination with race or gender.

Horizon Health provides transitional housing for the SMI (severely mentally ill) community.				

Provide a detailed description of current partnerships within the community include the name of the project/activity and how your agency partnered to make it successful.

- 1. Horizon Health: They had a client with a county housing voucher, and she needed short-term housing until the apartment got inspected, lease was signed, and keys were received. BAH provided three weeks of emergency shelter and filled that gap of preventing further homelessness.
- 2. Genesis: A client of theirs who was a Veteran and had a HUD voucher needed short-term housing until his permanent got inspected, lease was signed, and keys were received. BAH provided 10 days of emergency shelter and filled that gap of preventing further homelessness.
- 3. New Leaf: A married couple had a housing voucher and there were some issues in finding a landlord who would take the voucher. In partnering with Western Lifestyle Realty, Begin Again Homes located housing and provided three weeks of emergency shelter as they waited for final inspection, signing of the lease and receiving the keys. This filled the gap of preventing further homelessness.
- 4. Apache Junction Homeless Coalition: Begin Again Homes is a member and attended the 2023 Project Connect where we provided information on our services and connected with other agencies.
- 5. Pinal County End The Homelessness: Begin Again Homes is a member of this organization which provides us in getting people on the By Name List and keeps us informed of available housing vouchers and other resources.

BAH addresses the lack of affordable housing and the rise of homelessness in families, veterans, and senior citizens within Apache Junction.

Single families, two parent families, seniors, veterans and general population.

 Inflation. Lack of affordable housing. Unreasonable increases in lot rent. Lack of high paying jobs. Fixed Incomes.

What will happen if the problem is not addressed?

- 1. Illegal camping will increase.
- 2. Family's, veterans, senior citizens and members of the general population experiencing homelessness for the first time will be nonfunctioning civilians in Apache Junction.
- 3. Children will suffer emotionally and physically from the trauma of no longer having a roof over their heads and adjusting to living in a vehicle or camping in the desert.
- 4. Increase in crime.
- 5. Increase in panhandling.

What are the gaps between what exists and the solution?

The gap is that there is no emergency shelter or transitional housing for general population people which includes family's, senior citizens and veterans in Apache Junction.

The solution is for Begin Again Homes to provide emergency shelter in addition to transitional housing to those in need who have done all the necessary steps in obtaining a housing voucher.

The city is well aware of local citizens and local businesses concerns about the beautification of the desert, the cleanliness of our streets and usability of the parks.



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Project Proposal

Who: General population includes family's, senior citizens and veterans (with no substance or alcohol abuse, no mental illness, no criminal record) within Apache Junction.

What: Location to provide temporary housing by acquiring a permanent structure.

When: Within the next 12 months.

Where: Apache Junction.

Why: To prevent further increase in homelessness with family's, senior citizens and veterans of the general population. In addition, protecting the homeless children of our community.

Is this a best practice or has it been proven successful in other places?

- 1. This has been proven successful in other places such as Texas and California.
- 2. Horizon Health has success with this model addressing the severely mentally ill.
- 3. CASS Shelter, Phoenix (Central Arizona Shelter Service).

Is this a new or continuing project?

- 1. Obtaining a structure for transitional housing is a new project.
- 2. Providing emergency shelter to those who have housing vouchers and have found a participating landlord to provide housing is a continuing project.

Why is this a need to be addressed?

- 1. The city is growing.
- 2. The cost of living is not manageable for low-income families, senior citizens on fixed incomes or veterans.
- 3. There is limited affordable housing in Apache Junction.
- 4. During peak season, the possibility of decreased city revenue will increase due to the fact of the increase in the displaced homeless population.
