Information Submitted to the January 28, 2016 City Council Weekly Report

As evidenced by the recent flurry of donor recognition events during City Council meetings, the efforts to raise funds to support city projects and programs have continued to grow and mature.

Working with the Friends of Apache Junction, the support for such projects as the large animal training for first responders, Paws and Claws Care Center, the Thanks Goodness Its Friday ("TGIF") lunch program, the K-9 Drug/Search Unit, DARE, and the Police Department's Santa Toy Drive have been nothing less than amazing.

I would reach out to Friends Board President Karla Anthony, Chief Kelly, and Jeff Bell for the name of a person to be included in this process. Further, I would review the list of donors to identify possible persons for inclusion.
