Subject: Resolution 17-26, Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan

Pinal County Emergency Management staff in addition to staff from municipalities throughout Pinal County, collaborated over the past eighteen months to update the Pinal County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan ("Plan"). The resulting 2016 Plan is an updated version of the 2011 version adopted by resolution by our city in September 2011, with the origin of initial adoption in 2006. Resolution 17-26 will approve the adoption of this 2016 updated version for the city's planning purposes, affirming the monitoring and maintenance of the plan by the staff designated in the Plan for a period five (5) years.

Adoption of the Plan's revisions and maintenance actions are required by the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 and Federal Emergency Management Administration and would keep the City of Apache Junction eligible for certain categories of federal disaster monies.

The Public Works Department is requesting City Council to adopt the 2016 Pinal County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan as an official plan of the City of Apache Junction. An annual report on the progress of the implementation elements of the Plan shall be presented to the Mayor and City Council by October 31st of each calendar year.
