INTRODUCTION:

- WHO IS APACHE JUNCTION FOOD BANK (AJFB)?
 - AJFB started in Apache Junction in 1983. We are a tax-exempt organization incorporated under the name of Apache Junction Reach Out, Inc.
 - We changed our DBA to Superstition Community Food Bank (SCFB) to better represent the geography we serve.
 - We are the largest emergency food bank in the East Valley, sending more than 1.5 million pounds of food through our warehouse feeding almost 40,000 people a year.
 - We partner with the United Food Bank, St Mary's Food Bank, Feeding America, City of AJ and Pinal County.
 - Our Mission, "Together with our Volunteers and Partners, Apache Junction Food Bank, provides emergency food to qualified individuals and families in the East Valley communities with kindness, respect and dignity."

• We do three things:

- We provide food to area residents who are at or below 185% of the federal poverty level, (10,000/person/family).
- We refer to other community services as the need becomes known.
- We educate:
 - Community Resource Library
 - Peer to peer (staff, volunteer and clients) education
 - Food quality and healthy eating focus

- Our service area is approximately 100 sq. miles (McDowell to the north, Ocotillo to the south, Ellsworth to the west and Queen Valley to the east).
- We have ten-years left on our current lease for our building owned by Pinal County.

YESTERDAY:

- We distributed 1.6 million pounds of food to 36,600 people (43 lbs. per person.)
 - 60% (22,059) of the clients were Apache Junction residents.
- In 2019, AJFB saw a loss of \$163,000, due primarily to food inventory reduction.
- We spent \$309,020 in 2019 or \$8.44 administrative cost/person and \$74.39 food cost/person.
- The city of Apache Junction granted AJFB \$24,500 for your current fiscal year or \$1.09 per person.
- We operated with 125 volunteers/month from Apache Junction and Gold Canyon, providing a total of 17,957 volunteer hours for the year, plus a staff of 4.5 FTEs.
- We expanded services from 4 days a week to 5 days.
- We restructured our operations process to maximize capacity and to minimize costs.
- We renovated our office space to separate our client service area and add additional office space, funded by Pinal County, AJFB and public donations.
- We enhanced our board with new talented, diverse people to oversee and advise on our future growth (board member list attached).

TODAY:

- We expect an increase of 10% in Apache Junction residents due to:
 - Coronavirus
 - o Economic downturn
 - Negative repercussions of increased in minimum wage.
- SCFB budget for the year is \$359,500 or \$8.99 per person (a 6% increase).
- Challenges:
 - Drop-in amount of food donated by grocers
 - Added liability due to new truck purchase.
 - The public funded 50% of the truck and the food bank reserve is funding the remainder.
 - \circ $\;$ Need to increase food from Food Drives and Walk-ins.
 - o New Grants
 - Golf Outing and other fundraiser declines
 - Communications

- Other Programs:
 - o Project Help
 - Education Program
 - Nutrition
 - Recipes
 - Survey of Needs
- We are asking for \$27,500 from this committee or \$1.13 per Apache Junction resident served.

TOMORROW

- With the restructured operations, SCFB is planning to be able to handle any increase in needs from the 6,600 acres recently annexed by the city.
- We will need additional refrigeration.
- We may become a distribution center for United Food Bank.
