Subject: Household Hazardous Waste Events

Starting in November of 2018, the city has held two household hazardous waste events (HHW). The events are open for city and Pinal County residents just east of our city boundaries, including Gold Canyon. On October 15, 2019, the city entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement with Pinal County to reimburse the city for costs attributable to county resident participation in a maximum amount of \$20,000 (\$10,000 per event).

Residents can drop off white goods, document shredding, tires, electronic recycling and hazardous material during the HHW events. Our last two events that we hosted averaged 286 city and county residents.

Our next events are set for Saturday, November 21, 2020 and Saturday, March 6, 2021 from 8 am to 12pm.

Staff recommends entering into an agreement with Advanced Chemical Transport Inc, in the amount not to exceed \$80,000 for two HHW events.
