DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

"Humans are social beings, and we are happier, and better, when connected to others." Paul Bloom, Professor of Psychology and Cognitive Science, Yale University

The past year was challenging for everyone. At the library, all of our daily processes, from circulating materials to conducting programs, were analyzed through a COVID-19 lens. Masks, social distancing, cleaning, and plexiglass dividers became our new normal and made it difficult to provide personable customer service. But in the end, we found innovative ways to serve our community and stay connected.

While other libraries were offering "pop-in pickup" and curbside services (and many still are), our doors have been open since June 2020. We haven't taken the pandemic lightly, however. Patrons were encouraged to keep their visits short, seating was limited, computer sessions were reduced to one hour per day, and programs for all ages were offered virtually. In October 2020 we began offering small, in-person programs, and through a gradual, phased approach, while still adhering to CDC guidelines, we have safely transitioned to "near normal" library business. We take great pride in having kept our community digitally and physically connected during this difficult time.

Now a year later, we are focused on strengthening our community connections by increasing our inperson outreach activities and services. One of these activities will be the StoryWalk at Prospector Park. In partnership with Parks and Recreation and with grant funds from the Arizona State Library, this interactive reading experience will encourage families to enjoy a story while walking in a popular city park.

We are excited to welcome our patrons back to the library and to venture outside the building to build new relationships. We are so grateful for a new year and the many ways we will be connecting our community.


A new 4k camera, microphone, filmmaking kit and accessories provide virtual programming to all ages via pre-recorded and "live" events on social media.
