Economic Development Director Janine Solley presented background information on the CARES ACT Grant. The city received 95 applications and 84 of those applications qualified for the grant. The city was able to distribute \$577,568.57 to local businesses and non profits. These funds supported 168 part and full time employees within these businesses and non profits.

Mayor Serdy asked how much of the grant money will now go to Public Safety. Ms. Solley responded that a little over half of the grant funds will now go to Public Safety.

City Manager Bryant Powell thanked the committee for their hard work on going through all of the applications.

Μ. CALL TO PUBLIC

Jon Kenney, 93 S. Acacia Road in Apache Junction, stated that code and public safety are not doing their jobs. He showed pictures of a violation of a school bus that has to pull out into an intersection to see around a wall. He said he has brought this to code compliance many times and has been ignored.

George Schroeder, 2444 W. Virginia Street in Apache Junction, stated that nonprofits already get money from the state yet we keep giving them more. His opinion is that the city is not doing anything like they used to. His neighborhood is falling apart. He is demanding a 4 way stop in his neighborhood off of Delaware Drive. His streets have not been done in 45 years. He doesn't want people to be afraid of him. He wants his name off of the Republic bill.

Councilmember Barker requested that staff look into Mr. Kenny's concerns.
